

# Historical Statues



*You* can learn a lot by looking at

*historical statues. Take, for example, a statue of a soldier on a horse. Some things you can see right*

*away. You can tell how large or small the man was.*

*You can see what kind of uniforms soldiers once wore and what guns they carried. But you can also learn*

*some things that are not so obvious. There are certain things you can look for. For*

*instance, the horse can tell you how the soldier died. If it has all four hooves on the*

*ground, the man died a natural death. If one hoof is in the air, it means he died of*

*wounds received while fighting. If two hooves are raised, then the rider was killed right*

*on the field of battle.*
